On Tuesday 30th June 2009, it will be exactly one year since St Ninian's Church, also known as The Lower Kirk, belonged to Deerness again. Its history, tradition and heritage are now being kept in trust for the generations to come. To all who contributed to this, an enormous debt of gratitude is owed, THANK YOU! from The Friends of St Ninian's.

Successfully acquiring the building was only the first chapter of our story and a great deal of forward planning has been progressing to promote the long-term viability of the project. The first phase, of transition from the elected and constituted steering group to a company limited by guarantee, is now complete, and The Friends of St Ninian's are now in the process of becoming a registered charity.

The past year has seen a chain of fund-raising events, from lectures on Deerness Archaeology to Afternoon Teas on the day of the Deerness Boat Show; from the entertainment – A Deerness Yuletide, performed in St Ninian's, to the Blue Door Charity Shop in Kirkwall. This last raised an astonishing £3,600 over the two weeks, thanks to every attic and wardrobe in Deerness being cleaned out! Throughout this time, folk have been so generous, giving of their time, energy and money unstintingly.

The company's objects are to hold events in the Kirk, and other venues for the interest, benefit and bringing together of the local community and others throughout Orkney and further afield, to raise funds for the repair and upkeep of the Kirk, to produce a Friends newsletter, to undertake projects to advance our knowledge of, and to understand and value, both St Ninian's Kirk and the parish of Deerness, particularly projects which bring the generations together e.g. a project collecting old place-names, to set up an exhibit in the Kirk giving its history and to open the Kirk for quiet contemplation of a Sunday afternoon for all who wish to visit.

We are also supporting the current archaeological excavations at the Brough of Deerness, and ultimately, we wish to encourage local enterprise in Deerness, to create some employment opportunities by acting, with other local groups, for the long term health and vitality of Deerness, with St Ninian's as a focus for our belief in our community.

Since having the building open as a museum is not practical, the long term plan is to set up a 'virtual' heritage centre based on a website for Deerness. Many 'ologies' will go on it; there'll be advertising, and links to other websites, not to mention photographs of this wonderful place and its people. The concept has great potential, and there is so much talent in Deerness, and it's a technology that will involve the younger generation too! Grants should be available to set up such a community project. Any extra monies raised by the web-site, which are surplus to requirements for the fabric and upkeep of St Ninian's will be ploughed back into the community.

The first step in this direction is to create our own web pages on the Orkney Communities website, and in this respect we have already got a great boost, as Deerness has its own page on the Orkney International Science Festival website, courtesy of the Festival's Director, Howie Firth.
